If yes, please list the name of the plan(s) We are in the process of updating of our Comprehensive Plan, and while not adopted, intend to build upon it with this corridor plan. The Comp Plan is expected to be adopted by the end of the summer.

What is the goal of this plan? What are you looking to accomplish?

This corridor is markedly less friendly to pedestrians and cyclists, and has often been seen has disconnected from the rest of La Grange. South of 47th, the speed limit on LA Grange Rd drastically increases (from 25 to 35), but we have a number of residential properties. There are notable gaps in our sidewalks that lead to some pedestrians and cyclists in the roadway, or dangerously walking along gravel (also a major ADA issue). The commercial uses in the area is notably located in older, single-family homes., and on smaller sites with inadequate parking facilities. Access to these sites, whether vehicular or pedestrian, creates major concerns for safety. We feel this is a severely underinvested and underutilized node that needs to be better served. It has been difficult to balance the fact that this is an auto-oriented IDOT roadway but has a significant portion of single-family, multi-family, and smaller office/retail uses. It notable does not follow the same streetscape standards that can be observed on La Grange Road north of 47th street.

We hope to see this corridor considered as part of our overall La Grange Rd corridor, and see the investment we've seen north of 47th Ave in this same area. We hope to make this street friendly to pedestrians, cyclists, and transit users. Many have stated they have fears walking to nearby downtown, even though it is only a short walk. In doing this, the businesses on the corridor will also thrive.

There no other municipalities located along the corridor -Countryside is to the south, but has significant street and auto barriers. Once south into Countryside, it notably becomes much auto-oriented.
