We are proposing to boost and introduce an Equitable Development Planning to this new body of institutions and developers to explores walkable and friendly access to the Greenline station and to promote key transportation offerings for new institutional users and their management liaisons. The proposed project will allow us all to rethink the repurposing of other large lots and CTA parking lot and it's under the railroad open spaces that stretches a four block radius and as much as 2 and a half miles. To build financial support and design concepts for commercial building renovations and utilization of second and third floor spaces at key intersections in the targeted zone. To revisit Climate Resiliency relative to current and scheduled buildings and tree canopy/heat islands effects along Ashland Av and other West Englewood sectors.

The planning team will need to know that Tree Canopy and Layered landscaping is being encouraged at various points in Englewood. The Heat Watch project is still a big focus. The Chicago Police department and CTA have adopted the section of 55th to 63rd ,-Hamilton to Dan Ryan Expressway. The Chicago Plan Commission is scheduled to advance the Englewood Nature Trail in May 2024.
