2. Provide a detailed description of your MCRide is an existing program which provides coordinated dial-a-ride project. Explain what you are requesting service to individuals with at least one disability that limits or prohibits their ability to drive, older adults who are 60 years and over, and members of the general public. Riders are served through a contract between the County of McHenry and Pace Suburban Bus. Pace contracts with First Transit for bus and mobility management/Call Center operations, as well as with taxi companies to supplement the bus fleet.

> MCRide is a curb-to-curb, demand response service that operates seven days of the week, currently from 5:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. Service is provided to all municipalities and townships within McHenry County and seven point destinations outside of the County (Advocate Good Shepherd Hospital, Advocate Sherman Hospital, Chain O'Lakes State Park, Spring Hill Mall, Barrington Metra Station, The Arboretum in South Barrington, and Randall Oaks Zoo & Golf Course). There are no limitations on trip purpose.

> In January 2023, MCRide hours of operation were expanded, with the service operating from 5:00 am to 11:00 pm every day of the week. Ideally, our program would continue to expand its hours of operation to 24 hours of a day according to the demand for such expansion. These improvements to the program are in accordance with both Goal #2, as specified within the Human Services Transportation Plan.

> MCDOT has maintained a very successful relationship with several non-profit transportation services, most notably the Senior Care Volunteer Network (SCVN). In addition to sharing staff time and resources, MCDOT currently funds this program with direct support for this transportation program. By operating independently from the MCRide program, the SCVN can provide unique transportation options that best suit their clients individual transit needs. Most recently, MCDOT has partnered with the McHenry County Specialty Court (Drug Court, Mental Health Court, DUI Court) for client transportation services to reduce recidivism and to make the community safer while saving taxpayer resources. As more non-profits and subsequent transportation programs are created and identified by staff, we will continue to help share data, marketing materials, and refer residents to these new services, in hopes of pairing residents with the most appropriate transit option. These symbiotic relationships represent meeting the criteria within Goal #4 & Goal #7.

3. What entity is currently or will operate McHenry County Division of Transportation provides in-person support, financial resources and administrative assistance for the program. Pace Suburban Bus operates the service by providing and ensuring the rolling stock, and contracts with a third-party, First Transit, to provide staff to operate the service, and other operational assistance. This collaborative partnership has been in place since the inception of the program in 2010. The partnership between the two entities represents a strong community relationship to provide vital transit offerings to residents that rely on the service to travel freely within their communities.

4. How does this project improve access to other transportation services that go beyond the project's geographic boundary?

MCRide has full coverage within McHenry County, access to four different adjacent counties, with service connecting to several other transit services, including service up to the Wisconsin state border. There are seven points outside of McHenry County, at popular medical, recreational, and commercial locations were identified and also added to the coverage area as places where users could start or end their rides, further expanding the efficiency of the program.

The MCRide service directly links to numerous Metra stations on two different lines, four Pace fixed routes, and eight other dial-a-ride services in adjacent counties outside of MCRide's coverage area. This level of connectivity is ideal for transit riders that need to travel inter-county in an efficient manner.

5. How will the target population be given priority on all project activities, if the service is not restricted to the target population?

The MCRide service is not restricted to a certain demographic. However, many policies within the MCRide program encourage transit dependent populations (specifically those over 60 and with a disability) to utilize the MCRide service, including reduced fares and priority reservations.

The base fare for the General Public is \$3.00 for the first five miles, with a per-mile charge of \$0.25 for every mile after the first five. There is a reduced rate for Seniors (60+) and Individuals with Disabilities who have a base fare of \$1.50 for the first five miles, with a per-mile charge of \$0.25 for every mile after the first five. Staff plans to discuss implementing plans for capped fare rates at the upcoming Public Transit Advisory Committee in May, 2023.

For all rides taken on the MCRide service, reservations are required to be made at least two hours in advance, when capacity allows. When reserving rides for Seniors (60+) and Individuals with Disabilities, rides can be reserved up to seven (7) days in advance. Reservations for the General Public can be made two (2) days in advance. This policy prioritizes finding space on MCRide buses for the most transit-dependent demographics within McHenry County.

6. Describe how the project be marketed MCDOT continually educates on MCRide to individuals, agencies and special-interest organizations. Staff markets to potential program users and to social service agencies that work with targeted populations. Staff presents and tables with organizations and events, including the People in Need Forum, senior centers, transition programs, libraries, veterans groups, etc. Through the Public Transportation Advisory Committee (PTAC), staff educates human service agencies and local units of government, and they market to their own communities. The Public Transportation Advisory Committee is comprised of members from local communities, non-profits, and transit partners from the County that provide valuable input to enhance the public transportation network. MCDOT utilizes social media, mass e-mails/newsletters, and explain the system to new users and garner feedback. Brochures, Rider Guides and service area maps are regularly distributed.

> After English, Spanish is the most common language spoken in McHenry County. MCRide brochures are available in Spanish. The County has a Title VI program for Spanish-speaking clients. There are challenges in marketing the program to the Hispanic/Latino community, however, outreach will continue to agencies and organizations serving the Spanish-speaking populations to ensure they receive needed information.

7. How will this project utilize or coordinate with public transportation providers and /or other human service agencies? If the project will not include coordination, provide detailed explanation.

The McHenry County Public Transportation Advisory Committee (PTAC) meets quarterly to advance transit service coordination, improvement, and expansion in the County. MCRide is a primary topic addressed at PTAC meetings. PTAC attendees represent: Senior Care Volunteer Network. Senior Services, Pioneer Center for Human Services, Services for the Blind & Visually Impaired, Center for Independent Living, Continuum of Care to End Homelessness, Bicycle Advocates, Pace, Metra, RTA, McHenry County College, McHenry County Department of Health, McHenry County Planning & Development, McHenry County Council of Mayors, Visit McHenry County, Mental Health Board, townships, and municipalities.

To further support human service agencies' transportation needs, Universal Fare Cards are sold to provide trips on MCRide without the need to transfer cash to clients. To date, over 27,600 fare cards have been sold to local non-profits and government agencies for use on MCRide. Some of the organizations that have purchased fare cards include the McHenry County Crisis Program, 22nd Circuit Court Specialty Courts, Home of the Sparrow, Turning Point, Pioneer Center, Salvation Army, Family Health Partnership, Good Samaritan Ministry, Epilepsy Foundation, McHenry County Probation/Court Services, and Harvard Senior Center. Staff plans to continue to promote the availability of these fare cards.

8. Describe your organization's experience, knowledge, technical and administrative ability, and financial capacity to successfully and efficiently manage federal grants? Specifically, how will your organization manage this project?

Each year, the McHenry County Division of Transportation administers a significant amount of federal funds for various transportation projects throughout the department. Some of these funding sources include, but are limited to, Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement (CMAQ); Federal STP (STP-L, STP-C, STP-Bridge); Unified Work Program (UWP); and/or Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP). The department has become well-versed in the administrative, public engagement, financial allocation, and/or the reporting requirements that come along with the Federal, State, and local funds granted to our department's projects.

In addition, MCDOT has successfully administered the Section 5310 program funds for many years, as well as the JARC and New Freedom funds before that.

Please explain how you will gather and report on identified performance measures for this project and identify any additional performance measures that will be used.

As MCRide expanded its geographic coverage to the entirety of McHenry County in January 2021, there are no additional municipalities or townships to be included in the service area. MCRide recently expanded operating hours in January 2023, which have provided a transportation options for those working non-traditional working hours, off-peak medical appointments, and/or provide a viable option to prevent potential DUI's and the dangers they present. Staff has tracked ridership during the new hours of operation and has determined an increase in ridership in these new hours of operation. Staff will provide an update to the Public Transit Advisory Committee and the McHenry County Transportation Committee.

As stated previously, MCRide is a borderless, County-wide transit program operating during most hours of the day (5:00 AM - 11:00 PM).

In calendar year 2021, MCRide provided 86,455 trips (83,262 on buses and 3,193 on taxis).

In calendar year 2022, MCRide provided 86,239 trips (83,483 on buses and 2,756 on taxis).

In calendar year 2023, we estimate MCRide will provide 97,000 trips (93,000 on buses and 4,000 on taxis).

In calendar year 2024, we estimate MCRide will provide 100,000 trips (95,000 on buses and 5,000 on taxis).

- e. Recipients shall receive responses to their complaints, in writing, within ten (10) working days. Responses will contain the decision, supporting reasons for the decision, and any appropriate staff signatures with dates. Responses will also contain reference to the appeal procedure.
- f. All complaints, with associated responses, will be presented at the quarterly PTAC meetings.

D. Appeal Procedure

- a. If the complaint is not resolved to the satisfaction of the recipient, the recipient may appeal the decision.
- b. Appeals must be submitted in writing to the McHenry County Division of Transportation within five (5) working days of the recipient having received the original response.
- c. A staff member, different from the person who reviewed the initial complaint, will investigate all sides of the appeal and complaint.
- d. The recipient will be notified of the appeal decision and supporting reasons via phone call and in writing within ten (10) working days from the date the written appeal is received.

 - i. McHenry County hosts Public Transportation Advisory Committee (PTAC) meetings every quarter. Additionally, there is typically one Transportation Committee of the County Board and one County Board meeting are held each month. Notice of upcoming meetings is advertised on the County website, in local newspapers, and posted in the Administration Building. PTAC meetings are also publicized through an email/marketing system through which interested

- parties can sign up to receive news alerts. Recipients are encouraged to attend these meetings and provide comments during the public comment periods.
- ii. MCDOT staff responds to requests for in-person informational presentations from government, community-based and non-profit organizations throughout the County. Staff also attends forums and public meetings for other agencies and jurisdictions to provide opportunities for recipients to raise issues and ask questions.

b. Website

- i. MCDOT maintains a website that provides information to the public regarding MCRide, including: how dial-a-ride works, how to reserve a trip, service area, eligibility, fare structure, customer service, and rights under Title VI. The website includes an online form, phone number, and email address of MCDOT staff if questions arise and more information is needed.
- ii. MCRide is referenced on the Pace Suburban Bus Dial-a-Ride Directory website (http://www.pacebus.com/sub/paratransit/sd_dial_a_ride.asp).
- iii. MCRide information is posted on partner (municipal and township) websites.
- c. Informational Handouts: Members of the public and service recipients are given access to a MCRide Brochure and Rider's Guide that outline the MCRide program and services, including the Title VI program. These are widely disseminated in hard copy and electronically.

- d. During past outreach for transit services, McHenry County notes that it was rare for an individual to have no English skills. On the occasions when this did arise, family members or friends were often able to provide some level of spontaneous interpretation services.

Board / Committee Action Requested:

To authorize the Chairman of the County Board to submit an application to the Regional Transportation Authority for \$1,500,000.00 in Federal Section 5310 funding for the MCRide Diala-Ride Transit Program.

Background and Discussion:

This application is to continue providing Federal funding to reimburse the County for eligible operating costs. The application requests \$1,500,000.00 in operational grant monies to help fund MCRide for the next two years (\$750,000 in County FY24 and \$750,000 in County FY25).

MCRide is a demand response transit service provided through a contractual arrangement between the County and Pace. In January 2021 the MCRide was expanded to a countywide service, the first of its kind in the Chicagoland region. In addition to true borderless countywide service, seven point destinations outside of the County were added to the service to provide riders with additional options for inter-County travel. The hours of operation were also expanded in 2023, with the service operating from 5:00 am to 11:00 pm every day of the week.

Pace subsidizes the MCRide program at 50% of the Operating Deficit. The County was awarded \$600,000 in federal Section 5310 Federal grants in 2014, \$496,291 in 2016, \$840,000 in 2017, \$1,200,000 in 2018 and \$1,400,000 in 2021.

Section 5310 programs help meet the transportation needs of seniors 60 years and older and individuals with disabilities. This application is for \$1,500,000 for Federal fiscal years 2022 (\$750,000) and 2023 (\$750,000). This amount is equal to 50% of the estimated operational cost of services on MCRide for individuals with disabilities and for individuals 60 and older.

Historically, 25% of the trips provided on MCRide are taken by individuals over the age of 60; 35% of the trips are taken by individuals under the age of 60 with a disability; and 40% of the trips are taken by individuals considered to be general public. Nearly 60% of the program's ridership can therefore seek reimbursement from this federal Section 5310 grant.

Local share of operating costs for MCRide are budgeted annually and programmed in the 2023-2027 Transportation Program. This grant, if awarded, would reimburse the County after payments are made to Pace.
