7a. Ordinances Approving the Amendment of the 2023-2027 Capital Program, and extensions to ICE funded projects

Description: The first proposed ordinance is to the 2023-2027 Capital Program. This amendment incorporates changes in projects and funding for CTA and Pace. The second ordinance approves extensions to the Innovation, Coordination, and Enhancement (ICE) program for Metra.

7b. Ordinance Approving the Section 5310 – Enhanced Mobility for Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities Program of Projects

Description: The proposed ordinance authorizes the approval of the FY2022-FY2023 Section 5310 – Enhanced Mobility for Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities Program of Projects. Funding is proposed for 13 projects that support the goals of the Human Services Transportation Plan (HSTP).



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7c. Ordinance Approving the RTA's Title VI Plan 2023-2026

Description: The proposed ordinance approves the RTA's Title VI Plan for the period of 2023-2026. Recipients and sub-recipients of financial assistance from the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) are required to adopt Title VI programs to ensure non-discriminatory practices and meaningful access to benefits, services, information, and important activities for all persons regardless of race, color or national origin. The program must also contain the Agency's plan for meaningful participation by individuals with limited English proficiency.

7d. Ordinance Authorizing a Consultant Contract for the Far South Halsted Corridor Study

Description: The proposed ordinance authorizes the Executive Director to execute a two-year contract with TranSystems Corporation to develop the Far South Halsted Corridor Study for the RTA and Pace Suburban Bus.

7e. Ordinance Authorizing a contract for the Regional Transit Economic Impact Assessment

Description: The proposed ordinance authorizes the Executive Director to execute a firm fixed-price 12-month contract with Cambridge Systematics, Inc. to provide consulting services to the RTA for completing an assessment of the impacts and benefits transit has on the six-county region.
